



Hilton Head PSD Water Supply & Resiliency Projects

Hilton Head PSD is constructing a set of projects that will create water supply and resiliency for generations to come! These projects include:

- 1. Expansion of the PSD's Reverse Osmosis ("R.O.") Drinking Water Treatment Facility Capacity, from 4 million gallons a day of drinking water to 6 million gallons a day. The project includes drilling an additional groundwater well for the plant and adding an emergency power generator.
- 2. Constructing a 2nd Aquifer Storage & Recovery ("A.S.R.") Well. The well stores 260 million gallons of drinking water in the island's groundwater aquifer system in the winter months of lower demand, and then re-treats and distributes 2 millon gallons a day of drinking water in the spring and summer months of higher demand. It is an incredible asset for hurricane recovery.
- 3. Construction of a new Water Booster Pumping Station. The station will replace pumps that have been in service for more than 40 years. It will provide pressure for the drinking water distribution system.

These projects are funded in part by a \$10-million grant from the State of South Carolina and a \$1-million grant from Beaufort County.



An extensive inventory of our water distribution system found no lead piping in the PSD water distribution system.

The inventory was conducted over the course of several years as part of a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) requirement.

The PSD used extensive research and field observations to verify pipe materials. Decades-long, routine sampling of the water supplied by the PSD has found no lead in the tap water provided by the PSD. The inventory effort was led by PSD Water Quality Supervisor Sarah Hickman and PSD Project Manager Pete Schuelke, both of whom have been recognized by statewide water industry associations as outstanding water professionals.




The first step in changing the way you use water in the future is by understanding how much water you use today.

Old prescription medications, over-the-counter liquid, pills and even vitamins can unintentionally make their way to local waterways. Studies have found that medicines flushed down the drain become contaminates that can harm aquatic life and ultimately end up in our drinking water.

Help keep our local waterways clean by properly disposing of unused medications in one of Beaufort County's drop-off boxes.

Drop-off boxes can be found at Beaufort County Sheriff's Offices & the Bluffton Police Department. The drop-off boxes on Hilton Head and in Beaufort are open Monday through Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. The Bluffton location is open 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. You can also call to arrange a time after hours or on weekends.


