

Port Royal Community Charitable Fund awards \$5,000 grant to Project SAFE

The Port Royal Community Charitable Fund recently awarded a \$5,000 grant to Project SAFE (Sewer Access for Everyone) to help income-qualified homeowners connect to the Hilton Head PSD public sewer system.

Project SAFE is a charitable fund of the Community Foundation of the Lowcountry. Since its inception in 1999, SAFE has helped more than a thousand homes connect to the sewer system, ending reliance on septic systems that often fail on Hilton Head Island due primarily to unsuitable soil conditions.

PSD Commission Secretary Patti Soltys, a Port Royal resident, requested the grant on SAFE's behalf.


"The sewer connections made through Project SAFE not only benefit public health and environmental protection, but also workforce housing," said Soltys.



Hilton Head PSD earns 5-Year Partnership for Safe Water Directors Award

Hilton Head Public Service District (PSD) has earned the 5-Year Directors Award from the Partnership for Safe Water for its efforts toward optimization of its drinking water distribution system. The award recognizes the PSD's ongoing, rigorous self-assessment of its drinking water system. The award is earned via review by utility peers from around the country. PSD Water Quality Supervisor Sarah Hickman leads the self-assessment program.

The Partnership for Safe Water is an alliance of seven, national drinking water organizations, including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the American Water Works Association, and more than 500 water utilities. The goal of the Partnership is to optimize the protection of public health by improving utility performance beyond regulatory requirements.

"The PSD team is committed to providing the highest-quality water to our customers 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. We're very proud to be members of the Partnership for Safe Water," said General Manager Pete Nardi. "Earning the peer-reviewed 5-Year Directors Award is recognition of the team's commitment to quality for our customers and community."



July is Smart Irrigation Month!

Please make sure you're following Hilton Head's local ordinance on irrigation!

This ordinance limits outdoor irrigation to just two days a week—with even-numbered homes watering on Tuesdays & Saturdays and odd-numbered homes on Wednesdays & Sundays. Commercial properties have their own schedule, too.

Plus, all new irrigation systems must include a working rain sensor to prevent watering right after rainfall. That's a smart way to avoid waste — and it's the law!

Why does this matter? Residential irrigation accounts for a whopping 40–60% of our treated water use here on the island. By sticking to the rules — setting timers for early morning or evening and maintaining rain sensors — we help protect our local

water supply and environment. Water Smarter by following these water tips: • Avoid watering during the heat of the day — set your irrigation timer to the early morning or late evening hours. • Make sure you're not watering the sidewalk, driveway or road — direct your sprinklers to only water your lawn and/or plants. • Upgrade to a WaterSense-labeled irrigation system or hire a pro to help with your irrigation plan/make sure your system is working efficiently **More Water Efficiency** Tips

☐ Prep your water – stock 2 quarts per person/day (plus pets!), store in clean
sealed containers, and keep extras for flushing or washing.
\square Know your valves – learn where your main and appliance shut-offs are (e.g., wate
heater, washer) and how to use them before a storm.
☐ Keep your emergency kit stocked – include non-perishables, meds, flashlights,
chargers, hygiene items, pet supplies, and important docs.
☐ Secure your space – clear yard debris, check foundations, roofs, gutters, trim
trees, and secure sheds or loose items.

Hilton Head PSD is trained and ready \Box — but having your own backup plan is key to riding out any outage, boil-water alert, or service delay.



Help protect our island's sewer and waterways!

Please never flush wipes (even "flushable" ones), paper towels, cotton swabs, meds, hair, grease, kitty litter, or cigarette butts. These items can damage pumps, cause backups, and harm wildlife — costing thousands in repairs and risking environmental damage.

Instead, toss them in the trash.

Please also safely dispose of unused meds at Beaufort County drop-off boxes — no ID needed, just drop, seal, and done! Medication should never be flushed or thrown in the trash.

Tip: Only flush the "4 Ps" — pee, poo, toilet paper, puke.
